November 11, 2015—The St. Mary's River Watershed Association was honored at Patagonia's Washington DC store last month with a grant earmarked for the oyster reef restoration project located adjacent to St. Mary's College of Maryland.

"We have about \$34,000 to give away this fiscal year in two rounds-October and February," said DC store manager Mark Stevens at the award presentation. "This round we awarded nearly \$18,000 to five organizations. My staff was so excited when they reviewed the St. Mary's River proposal. It is



something they all want to get involved in, 'I want to do this' was their chant. It was certainly our #1 pick."

"We are honored to receive this generous grant from a reputable international corporation—one that is founded on the principle of sustainability and gives back 1% of gross revenue to the community," said Association president Joe Anderson.

The oyster reef project is a partnership project of the Leonardtown Rotary Club, St. Mary's College of Maryland, and the St. Mary's River Watershed Association. 
Water Clarity Breaks Old Record

Water clarity has been exceptional this fall and we have been rewarded with awesome underwater photos of our reef project. On October 22 the Secchi disk reading for water clarity was 3.5 meters or about 11.5 feet. That is more than 1 1/2 feet greater than the previous record for clarity set November 6, 2014. We meassure water clarity on (or near) our reef restoration site in order to document the impact of our work. The restoration site is actually only about nine feet deep at its deepest point, so the reading was taken offshore about 20 yards.

"The reefs are thriving with oysters—some areas are so dense with oysters that the underlying structures cannot be seen," said project director Bob Lewis after diving on the project site on October 9th and 11th. Sponges, mussels, and barnacles fill in the spaces left between the oysters, as can be seen in the photos below.

"Seeing the natural strike and the oysters growing so quickly is so rewarding," said student intern Meghan Webster who dove with Lewis last month. "I'm so lucky to be a part of this exciting project."

The Association has planted nearly 30 million spat (baby oysters) in the five-acre project area. But the photos below appear to indicate that natural recruitment on the reef structures is outpacing the Association's plantings.
